The Iwata Hachiman Shrine Autumn Festival was held on Saturday, October 5th, and over 50 children from the children's group participated in the portable shrine procession. Although it rained at times, the children enthusiastically went around the town playing flutes and drums. This year, junior high school students also came to help out, and were very active in directing traffic and assisting with events.

The autumn festival of Iwata Hachimangu Shrine and Kotohira Shrine was held over two days, October 4th and 5th, co-hosted by five towns. In Higashiwata, the traditional float carrying children's drums was dedicated at the shrine on the first day, and although the course was slightly changed, the festival was able to finish without incident. Nearly 150 people, both adults and children, participated in pulling the float. Hand-held fireworks were dedicated at the shrine on the first day, and a quiz rally and rice cake throwing event were held on the second day.

Crime prevention seminars



On October 7th, the Deputy Chief of Toyohashi Police Station held a Fraud Prevention Seminar at Iwata Civic Hall. There have been many cases of fraud using malicious methods to defraud people of their savings, such as fake police scams, social media-based investment scams, and refund scams.

Tips to avoid being deceived by scams

- 1) If a police officer, prosecutor, etc. instructs you to make a bank transfer, fraud is suspected.
- 2) If a celebrity or someone you don't know sends you a message on social media, suspect it's a scam.
- 3) If someone tells you to take your cell phone to an ATM or bank, you might be suspecting a scam.



※ If the topic of money comes up, hang up the phone, check the other person's phone number, and consult with a family member or other relative.
