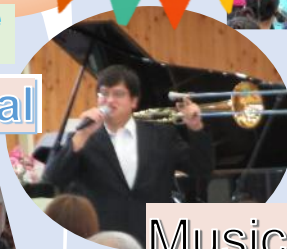
On October 25th and 26th, parents and children enjoyed workshops where they could try making soba noodles and crepes.

Today, I'd like to introduce you to the "Joint Training with the East Branch" that the Fire Department conducts every two months! Yes, we do it properly when we need to (We're the type to work hard behind the scenes...).

First, in May, the first training session of the fiscal year was held, and we covered the "Basics of Firefighting Activities." We covered firefighting equipment, hydrant operation, water discharge, hose extension practice, and fire vehicle navigation. This first session of the new fiscal year allowed new recruits to get hands-on with the equipment, learn how to use it, and communicate with fellow firefighters, gradually integrating into the team.

The second session was "Chainsaw Operation and Maintenance in Disasters." We covered how to use chainsaws in the event of a typhoon or other natural disaster, as well as chainsaw fuel, chain oil, and blade maintenance. On this day, participants learned the precautions to take when using chainsaws.

The third session was "How to Use a Chainsaw, Engine Cutters, Hydraulic Spreaders, and Jacks." Participants practiced cutting wood with a chainsaw and iron pipes with an engine cutter, a piece of equipment with a rapidly rotating, disc-shaped blade. Using the hydraulic spreader and jack, participants practiced gradually expanding and spreading heavy objects, such as collapsed houses. This has been a long post, but I'm curious to know what they'll do next...

Toyooka Lifelong Learning Center Relocation and Complex Project

Projects are underway to combine the Toyooka Lifelong Learning Center and Toyohashi Civic Clubhouse within Iwata Sports Park, with the aim of opening in fiscal year 2030. This fiscal year (2025), a total of three workshops will be held at the Toyooka Lifelong Learning Center to formulate a master plan, and the combined project will proceed while incorporating feedback from the workshops.

The first workshop (October 13th) was held under the theme of "Let's discuss our thoughts on the new facility and park," and was attended by approximately 40 local residents. Everyone shared their thoughts on the new facility, including the installation of an elevator, the separation of the library and study rooms, and how the facility should harmonize with Suijin Pond.

The second workshop (December 7th) will be held under the theme of "We hope the new facility and park will be like this," while the third workshop (February 15th) will be held under the theme of "Toward the development of the new facility."
