## Evacuation Shelter

**When evacuating to an evacuation shelter, take with you all the things you need.**

Regarding evacuation when evacuation shelters are opened during storms and floods such as heavy rains and approaching typhoons...

In the event of a wind or flood forecast that allows you to evacuate in advance, you should use your own judgment to evacuate to an evacuation shelter with the following items as necessary: blankets, food, a radio, a flashlight, a mobile phone charger, and essential medications.

\*The blankets, food, etc. stored in evacuation centers are intended to be provided to evacuees in the event of a sudden major earthquake.
