Introduction to Kitaiwata

My name is Nagashima and I am the head of the Kitaiwata 1st Neighborhood Association. Today, I would like to introduce some neighborhood association activities that are unique to Kitaiwata 1st .

First, I would like to introduce the holding of BOSAI seminars by the neighborhood association. Recently, with reports of frequent earthquakes occurring all over the world, we are forced to think of them as something that affects us, not something that happens to other people. This marks the second year that we in Kitaiwata 1st Ward have started holding BOSAI seminars with the aim of making it an initiative that affects us. We receive advice from the city hall and other organizations, focusing on self-help and mutual aid. Statistically, it is said that local governments that have a strong sense of mutual aid suffer less damage. I would like to aim to be that kind of local government.



The second is the mochi-pounding event held at the end of every year. In Kitaiwata 1st, people have had stone mills since long ago, and they gather together to pound mochi. The mochi that is made is then arranged in various ways, such as mizu-mochi, bean-jam mochi, karami-mochi, and walnut mochi, and then eaten by all who participated in the event at the community center. The taste of the freshly made mochi is, above all, exceptional.

Thirdly, Kitaiwata 1st plans its own Bus trips and Drinking parties to promote communication. They are trying to ensure that participants have a good time and enjoy themselves harmoniously,

regardless of age or gender. Thanks to the location, there is a Saizeriya restaurant nearby, so there are opportunities to hold drinking parties. Although drinking parties are split evenly, it is a great environment to be in, with the cost ranging from 1,000 to 1,500 yen per person, even if you eat and drink a lot.

We hope to further strengthen our connections through these kinds of interactions.

Oral care during Disasters

Oral care (keeping the mouth clean) accounts for 30-40% of disaster-related deaths, preventing bacteria from entering the body and infections, and ultimately preventing disaster-related deaths.
