Do you know "Blue Patrol"





A "blue patrol" is a vehicle equipped with a blue rotating light for voluntary crime prevention patrols. Normally, it is prohibited to equip vehicles with blue rotating lights. When groups or organizations that meet certain requirements conduct crime prevention patrols, they can equip their vehicles with blue rotating lights and conduct crime prevention patrol activities with certification and permission from the police station. Crime prevention patrol activities using blue patrols are highly visible and allow for wide area patrols. (From the Metropolitan Police Department website) The Iwata Voluntary Crime Prevention Blue Patrol Team, with 29 registered blue patrol vehicles and 58 registered members, patrols the school routes and park areas within the Iwata two days a week, twice a day (when elementary school children are going home and at dusk), 96 days a year.
