



Introducing Kitaiwata 3rd

My name is Keiji Aratsu, and I am the neighborhood association president for Kitaiwata 3rd. I'm a rookie, having only become president in April of 2025. Strangely enough, this year I don't mind



Kitaiwata 3rd is located north of a straight line connecting the Iwata Civic Hall, which is 26 meters above sea level, and the Toyo Lifelong Learning Center, which is 31 meters above sea level. The name Iwata suggests the hard geological layers of the Yumigahama Mountains. Meanwhile, Toyohashi City has areas at sea level, the Toyokawa River, a first-class river, and mountains. I think the Iwata which lacks such areas, is a safe place. Looking at the hazard map, even feel reassured. If the Iwata were to be affected by a disaster, the entire Toyohashi City area would be hit by a major disaster. This would delay external reconstruction assistance. Disasters are unpredictable. We need to maintain a good town at all times so that the townspeople can help each other no matter when a disaster strikes. We need to be able to repair ourselves.

Finally, I'd like to introduce one of the BOSAI activities in Kitaiwata 3<sup>rd</sup>. Kitaiwata 3<sup>rd</sup> has two parks, separated by a bypass. Both are neighborhood parks that serve as temporary evacuation sites. Each month, different groups clean the parks. The purpose is not so much to make the parks clean, but to get the neighbors to meet each other. By cleaning the parks in groups, it encourages people to visit the temporary evacuation site and makes it easier to build relationships with neighbors. Cleaning the park also earns money from the city, so even though neighborhood association fees are low, it allows for savings to be made in case of emergencies, so it's a win-win situation.
